Morocco

YEAR ONE

Morocco is a country in North Africa.

YEAR TWO

Morocco is a country in the Maghreb region of North Africa. The capital city of Morocco is Rabat, however, Casablanca is the largest city in the country.

YEAR THREE

The total population of Morocco in 2021 was estimated to be 37,076,584 people. Morocco is situated next to the country of Algeria to its east, and the country of Mauritania to its south. The Mediterranean Sea lies to the north of Morocco and the Atlantic Ocean to the west.

YEAR FOUR

Morocco is characterised by a rugged mountain interior, large tracts of desert, and a lengthy coastline along the Atlantic Ocean and Mediterranean Sea. It is one of only three nations (along with Spain and France) to have both Atlantic and Mediterranean coastlines. A large part of Morocco's landscape is mountains, with the Atlas Mountains being located

mainly in the centre and south of the country. Most people live in areas close to the coastline, or on fertile farms.

YEAR FIVE

Mining, agriculture, fishing and tourism are the 4 main parts of Morocco's national economy. Many Moroccans work in Europe (about 2 million) and send billions of Euros of money home to their families every year. Tourism is becoming very important in Morocco. Many Americans and Europeans come to see the historical places of Morocco, live the Berber countryside life, or enjoy the warm sun and long, clean beaches. The most popular city for tourists is the city of Marrakesh.

YEAR SIX

Berber and Arab cultures define, what is now considered, the "Moroccan" ways of daily life. The Berbers are the indigenous residents of Morocco. The Arab people came in the 7th Century and conquered the country. The official languages of Morocco are Arabic and Berber however French is also used in some places. Morocco was part of the French colonial empire for 44 years. Some people in the north (close to Spain) speak Spanish as well. Spain also occupied parts of Morocco before leaving them in 1956 and 1975. Most educated Moroccans do not speak English well however in the 21st century English is being taught to students in an increasing number of schools. Most Moroccans follow Islam as their religion, but there are also a very small number of Christians, Jews and non-believers.
